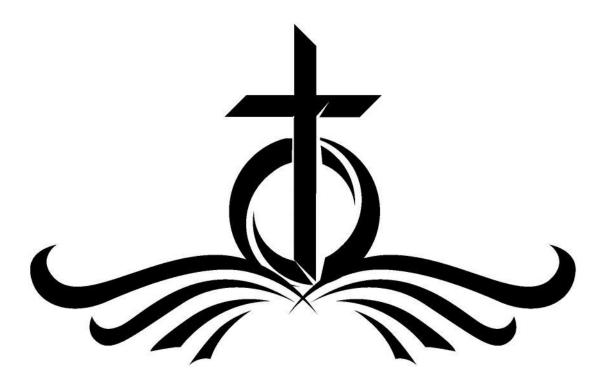

#### ANNUAL REPORT Rev. Mary Ann Banning Interim Pastor

It has been such a pleasure to work with you in ministry for Christ during the last nine months. I find this congregation to be deeply rooted in faith, eager to learn and grow spiritually, and courageous in facing ministry challenges.

Your last pastor, Rev. Chuck Compton, was here for 25 years so welcoming and working with an interim pastor is something new for all of you. Thank you for your warm and caring welcome and thoughtful appreciation of the work that I have been called to perform for and with you.

The transitional ministry tasks are: "guiding the congregation's grief work over the loss of their previous pastor, preparing for a variety of changes in the ministry and mission of the congregation, and readying the congregation to accept a new installed pastor."<sup>1</sup>

I spent the first few months getting to know you and visiting as many of you as I could in your homes. As we conversed, I listened for your hopes and dreams for this congregation and shared those in general with the Session. An important part of a transitional minister's effectiveness is to take care of the congregation as pastoral care needs develop, and I have enjoyed making hospital and care facility visits, as well as supportive home visits.

One of my interim specific tasks is to work with the leaders of your congregation as they focus on future planning and learn about the challenges of this ministry setting here in Flora. The Session has read Christianity for the Rest of Us by Diana Butler Bass, and is in the process of reading In Search of the Unchurched, an Alban Institute book by Alan C. Klaas.

The congregation has five specific developmental tasks to accomplish during this transitional period:

- 1. coming to terms with history
- 2. discovering a new identity
- 3. allowing and empowering new leaders
- 4. renewing denominational linkages
- 5. committing to new leadership and a new future

We have had a Gathering on the Past, during which we looked back over the entire span of the history of this congregation, discussing successes and challenges and observing patterns. Our Gathering on the Present will be held soon, in which we will look at demographic information and discuss some of the main points in the book 'In Search of the Unchurched'. Our Gathering on the Future will happen on Sunday, March 1st. We will explore the idea of developing and articulating a purpose for the congregation that the Session can use for future planning. The insights from these gatherings will be used to write the position description for your next pastor.

As part of the planned schedule for the transitional process approved by Session, the Nominating Committee will meet to recommend members to be elected by the congregation in May of 2015.

## Annual Report of the Congregational Life Committee

The Flora Presbyterian Congregational Life Committee held fellowship gatherings and other events throughout 2014.

January - We were closed for two Sundays due to weather on the 5th & 26th.

## 13 Annual Report of the Trustees

Special thank you to all church members that help with maintaining the building and grounds of our church.

We saw a 20% increase in our church Insurance premium. We are working with our insurance provider to minimize our safety concerns and keep our premiums as low as possible.

Kevin Clark and Kent King have studied future concerns for the trustees and developed a prioritized list.

We have accepted a bid from Skiles Heating and Electric to replace our furnaces (\$6,848.64). This work should be completed in the spring of 2015.

We discontinued our service agreement on our copier this year because our copier is obsolete. Session is studying replacement of copier and printers in our church office. The use of capital funds to pay for furnace and office equipment will be required as these items are above and beyond our annual budget.

We are looking to replace ceiling tiles in basement and a service contract with Hamilton Construction to maintain our lighting.

## 15 Christian Education Annual Report

Serving on the Christian Education committee in 2014 were Barb Mayfield, Tammy Moss, Laraine MacLauchlan, Barbara Wilkinson and Laurie Brower. This committee oversees Sunday School, the nursery and Junior Church, Safe Child, Bible Studies and small groups, Vacation Bible School, our Oasis ministry, our church's library, involvement in Christian retreats, and anything that involves discipleship and growth in our Christian walk.

### **Sunday School**

This fall we started a new time for adult Sunday School, meeting after fellowship from 11:45 to 12:30. We studied the Gospel of John in the fall followed by a study during Advent to prepare for calling a new pastor.

## **Vacation Bible School**

Working with Flora Presbyterian and Cutler Presbyterian, the Flora Christian Church hosted a one day VBS on Saturday, July 26<sup>th</sup>. The theme was "Gangway to Galilee." Attendance was sparse but the generosity of the three church congregations to the mission project was overwhelming. We raised over \$2000 which was enough to purchase a Jesus Well and several water bio-filters through Gospel for Asia.

## **Great Banquet**

In 2014, we had members serve on and attend Great Banquet retreat weekends. Pastor Mary Ann was a guest at the Women's Lafayette Great Banquet in the fall.

## Library

For 2014, we served our Church family (including Oasis) to the tune of 162 items circulated from January through December. Librarian, Laraine MacLauchlan withdrew 119 books and added 130 books and DVD's to the collection, 18 of which are DVD's. The Oasis children have been the inspiration to make the children's and young adult's section more appealing and new purchases have concentrated on those titles, but we have also added books purchased from book sales at local libraries, including adult fiction and non-fiction titles such as Shelley Shepard Gray's "Grace." A wonderful donation of 22 books distributed by Guideposts from Libby Sparks and Laurie Brower has increased the adult fiction section considerably. They are delightful mysteries and such.

## Oasis

Our 12<sup>th</sup> year of Oasis, our mid-week ministry for children and families, ran through spring 2014 and our 13<sup>th</sup> year kicked off in September. We concluded a study of "The Story" in 2013-14 and this year's theme is the family. The adults are studying Focus on the Family's "The Family Project." Highlights of the year included our annual bowling trip in February, swim party in April, cookout and putt-putt golf in August and carnival in Sept. Our hayride this fall was hosted by the Cutler Presbyterian Church. Our Christmas Celebration to finish the year was attended by over 100 children and parents. We are so grateful to the many people who volunteer week in and week out.

## Annual Report of the Mission and Stewardship Committee

Roman 5:3-5 reminds us... "Not only so, but we also glory in our sufferings, because we know that suffering produces perseverance; perseverance, character; and character, hope. And hope does not put us to shame, because God's love has been poured out into our hearts through the Holy Spirit, who has been given to us."

2014 was our year of perseverance! In the 1<sup>st</sup> Quarter of 2014, we had no pastor, we had not completed our stewardship campaign, and the winter was the worst one in 30 years. We did not even have church for two Sundays in January. But, here it is one year later, January 2015, and we made it!

By April 1<sup>st</sup>, Mary Ann Banning started as our interim pastor. We had raised pledges and contributions of \$81,000 and were ready for spring! For this year's One Great Hour of Sharing we raised \$981. Throughout the year we have raised \$1,965 for our Oasis program, \$1,293.50 for the Hunger Fund, \$100 for the Peace and Global Witness offering, and \$300 for the Joy offering. I am very fond of Winston Churchill's quote during World War II: "Never, Never, Never, Never give up."

Additionally, we collected for the food pantry, provided Christmas baskets for 8 families, prayed for our friends, neighbors, the world, and for each other. We are a family in the midst of change, we must love and support each other if we are truly followers of Christ. I personally thank you for your giving, your warmth, and your love.

Looking ahead to 2015; Our pledges and contributions are projected at \$72,000, but we have projected expenses to exceed that amount. I discussed this at our November 2014 Congregational meeting. The session believes the church needs this year to search for and find a new called pastor, and that we need to retain Mary Ann as our interim pastor to meet that goal. To achieve our 2015 budget and goals, it will require spending from our savings to meet general expenses. That amount will most likely be between 15 and 20 thousand dollars. The session would very much like that amount to be less. The session asks each member to prayerful consider your pledges and contributions for 2015, "Is God asking us to give more?"

As you can see from the included Treasurer's and Financial Secretary reports, we finished 2014 with very little deficit spending, which is a testament to each member's faithfulness, and in many ways our perseverance.

One last thing, please feel free after reviewing our financial reports to ask me questions at our January 25<sup>th</sup> congregational meeting. I have prepared, as best I can, to be a knowledgeable resource for you.

May all the blessings of Christ be upon our congregation in this pivotal year of 2015.

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## Flora Presbyterian Church Corporation By-Laws Proposed Revisions

November 13, 2014

SEC. III – Officers

## Article 1

### Current wording:

The officers of this church shall consist of the pastor/moderator, seven elders (three of whom are elected as trustees) who are elected by the congregation, and a treasure and financial secretary who are appointed by the session.

#### Proposed wording:

The officers of this church shall consist of the pastor/moderator, a minimum of three elders and maximum of nine elders (with two to three of whom are elected as trustees) who are elected by the congregation, and a treasure and financial secretary who are appointed by the session.

#### Reason for the Change:

The size of our current congregation does not support having seven elders. The proposed wording allows the number of elders to be increased as our congregation grows.

## Article 2

#### Current wording:

The seven elders shall be divided into three classes (classes shall consist of 2, 2, & 3 members), one class of whom shall be elected each year at the annual meeting held in November for a three year term. No elder shall server on the session for the consecutive terms, either full or partial, aggregating more than three years, but shall be ineligible to be elected to a new term until one year shall have elapsed.

#### Proposed wording:

The three to nine elders shall be divided into three classes, one class of whom shall be elected each year at the annual meeting held in November for a three year term. An elder can server on consecutive terms, during an interim period when the church is in undergoing a Pastoral Call. Otherwise no elder shall server on the session for the consecutive terms, either full or partial, aggregating more than three years and shall be ineligible to be elected to a new term until one year shall have elapsed.

#### Reason for the Change:

Allowing session members to continue to remain on session during a period of finding a new Pastor provides for continuity in the search.
