Extra copies will be available to congregation members who would like to read it with us. This book takes a careful look at the exciting things that are happening in neighborhood churches that have been successful with redevelopment and transformation. She tells the stories of ten different congregations of different denominations in widely varying settings. It is an inspiring book for our congregations that are struggling with growth, financial, and ministry issues.

This is a deeply faithful, loving congregation, and I am blessed to be ministering here in Flora with you during this transitional time.

As summer approaches please be thinking about special music ideas to begin after the choir takes its summer vacation.




We will be having a prayer vigil and light lunch the 1<sup>st</sup> Sunday of every month following service and fellowship.
