The Living Church

"The Church's one foundation is Jesus Christ her Lord; She is His new creation by water and the word; From heaven he came and sought her to be His holy bride; With His own blood he bought her, and for her life he died."

These words from the 19th century Wesley hymn "The Church's One Foundation" sing of the wonder and joy of "being church." We are children of the God who sent the Son out of an incomprehensibly deep love for human beings -- a costly, grace-filled love. So it is appropriate at this point in our congregation's transitional journey to be informed and challenged by Scripture.

Our congregation will gather after worship during the first three Sundays of Advent (Nov. 30, Dec. 7, and Dec. 14) for a **crock-pot soup or chili lunch followed by Bible Study in small groups in the fellowship hall.** We will be studying Scripture passages that will help us focus our table discussions on the nature of God's call to the church and the ministry that the church is called to engage in today. This experience will help us ground our thinking, planning, and dreaming for the future in God's Living Word, the Bible.

These Bible study conversations are a vital part of our ongoing preparation for the coming of this congregation's new pastor. It is appropriate to be in a spirit of expectation and wonder as we wait once again for the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ, born into this world as our Savior. In what do we base our hopes, our longings for this congregation's future ministry? The simple answer is in Christ's transformative presence with us through the presence of the Holy Spirit . . . let us open ourselves to that very Spirit as we talk about Christ's specific call to us here at Flora Presbyterian Church during the first three Sundays of Advent.

Who are we and what are we for? Whose are we? We will formulate answers to these important questions together as we warm ourselves with homemade soup and the warmth of Christian fellowship.

reach.




We welcome Becky Amos
