Come, Thou Long Expected Jesus

"Come, Thou long expected Jesus, born to set Thy people free; From our fears and sins release us; let us find our rest in Thee. Israel's strength and consolation, Hope of all the earth Thou art; Dear desire of every nation, Joy of every longing heart."

These familiar words from the Charles Wesley hymn, "Come Thou Long Expected Jesus" set to Witt's *Psalmodia Sacra* music written in 1715 express the longings of our hearts during the Advent season. It's not the shopping, not the gifts, not the tinsel and false togetherness of the commercial Christmas shopping season that fulfills the longings of our hearts. It's Jesus who does. It's the promise of redemption, of forgiveness, and of the joy that comes with salvation that warms and gladdens our hearts.

Come, thou long expected Jesus. Come and set your people free!

I encourage you to set time aside every day to be with God in prayer, in silence . . . focus your mind upon your heart's desire, a closer relationship with Christ. Open your inner self to God's great gift, coming to us again to us in just a few precious weeks -- the gift of a Savior, of God With Us.

What gifts from God are we expecting for our congregation during this time of transition and change, as we prepare for the called pastor that God has in mind for us? Gifts that come to mind for me are the fruits of the Spirit that can be found in Paul's letter to the Galatians . . . "love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control." These are qualities that we must cultivate, work towards, and keep always before us as Christian believers. Paul goes on to say in 5: 24-26, "And those who belong to Christ Jesus have crucified the flesh with its passions and desires. If we live by the Spirit, let us also be guided by the Spirit. Let us not become conceited, competing against one another, envying one another."

Advent is a time of introspection, of looking honestly and clearly at one's self and one's behavior in order to begin anew. As we wait for the coming child, let us open ourselves to the possibility of a new way of being in relationship with one another, one based upon love, respect, and compassion. This is one of the recurring blessings of the Advent season -- the hope of newness in our lives. Join with me in Bible study and discussion after worship during the first three Sundays of Advent. Let us be guided by Scripture as we prepare for the blessings that are yet to come for this faithful congregation.

We will gather together again as a congregation for our second congregational discussion, the **Gathering on the Present**, after worship on **January 18, 2015**. I will present some current demographic data on the Flora area that will help us look at how the community has changed in the last 25 years. One vital element of preparing to elect a pastoral nominating committee is to gather information on the current ministry setting of our church. When we are ready to elect the P.N.C. next spring, the information gathering and discussions will have already taken place, so all they need do is put the information into a readable form for interested pastors to consider.

May the peace and joy of the Advent and Christmas season bless you abundantly,

Flora Presbyterian Church Corporation By-Laws **Proposed Revisions**

November 13, 2014

SEC. III - Officers

Article 1

Current wording:

The officers of this church shall consist of the pastor/moderator, seven elders (three of whom are elected as trustees) who are elected by the congregation, and a treasure and financial secretary who are appointed by the session.

Proposed wording:

The officers of this church shall consist of the pastor/moderator, a minimum of three elders and maximum of nine elders (with two to three of whom are elected as trustees) who are elected by the

congregation, and a treasurer and financial secretary who are appointed by the session.

Reason for the Change:

The size of our current congregation does not support having seven elders. The proposed wording allows the number of elders to be increased as our congregation grows.

Article 2

Current wording:

The seven elders shall be divided into three classes (classes shall consist of 2, 2, & 3 members), one class of whom shall be elected each year at the annual meeting held in November for a three year term. No elder shall server on the session for the consecutive terms, either full or partial, aggregating more than three years, but shall be ineligible to be elected to a new term until one year shall have elapsed.

Proposed wording:

The three to nine elders shall be divided into three classes, one class of whom shall be elected each year at the annual meeting held in November for a three year term. An elder can server on consecutive terms, during an interim period when the church is in undergoing a Pastoral Call. Otherwise no elder shall server on the session for the consecutive terms, either full or partial, aggregating more than three years and shall be ineligible to be elected to a new term until one year shall have elapsed.

Reason for the Change:

Allowing session members to continue to remain on session during a period of finding a new Pastor provides for continuity in the search.

We have a busy December at church this year! Our annual JOY OFFERING this year will be taken on Dec. 7th. December 2 of the property of the pr




year will be taken on Dec. 7th, Dec. 14th, and Dec. 21st. This is an offering that does so much.
