

## A Time for Ministering and Living in the Present

"Do not remember the former things, or consider the things of old. I am about to do a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it? I will make a way in the wilderness and rivers in the desert." (Isaiah 43: 18-19 NRSV)

We have come to the time in our transitional process when together we will look at our ministry and our community in the present time . . . that is, we will look closely at how Flora and our congregation are a new creation in comparison to the prior twenty-five years of ministry.

On Sunday, January 18<sup>th</sup>, we will gather as a congregation to hear a presentation of demographic data compiled through a program provided by the Presbytery of Wabash Valley to help churches understand their community better. Jay McMillin has produced a print-out from this program for our use. It is very important that all of us participate in the discussion together after the presentation. I will be taking notes, and the information and insights will be given to our Pastoral Nominating Committee when it forms in the spring of 2015 to become a part of the position description for the search process.

We have completed the Gathering on the Past. We will complete the Gathering on the Present on January 18th, 2015. Our Gathering on the Future will be scheduled by the Session sometime in February. Information from each of these gatherings is very important for the development of the Mission Information Form (the position description that pastors view on-line). We need input from all of you in order to move forward with this process. Your individual point of view and opinion is needed, so the Session invites you to be an active participant in all of these gatherings.

We live in interesting times . . . the old ways of "doing and being church" are not as productive or satisfying as they were decades ago. Our culture has changed and is no longer church or faith-centered. Congregations find themselves in competition with many other scheduled events on Sunday mornings and through the week. It is no longer a given that everyone belongs to and attends a church. Electronic communication is rapidly replacing "snail mail" and other forms of advertising. Many congregations have realized that in order to communicate the good news of the gospel effectively, they must rethink the structures and process of church ministries.

Challenging as it is, future ministry for Christ is a new thing that God is creating in our midst. I encourage us to move into the future with anticipation and joy, for Jesus Christ is our companion and our guide. As Scripture reminds us continually, "Nothing is impossible with God."

May the blessings of faith in Christ encourage us on our journey,

Flora Presbyterian Church Corporation By-Laws Proposed Revisions

November 13, 2014

SEC. III – Officers

#### Article 1

### **Current wording:**

The officers of this church shall consist of the pastor/moderator, seven elders (three of whom are elected as trustees) who are elected by the congregation, and a treasure and financial secretary who are appointed by the session.

### Proposed wording:

The officers of this church shall consist of the pastor/moderator, a minimum of three elders and maximum of nine elders (with two to three of whom are elected as trustees) who are elected by the congregation, and a treasurer and financial secretary who are appointed by the session.

### Reason for the Change:

The size of our current congregation does not support having seven elders. The proposed wording allows the number of elders to be increased as our congregation grows.

#### **Article 2**

### **Current wording:**

The seven elders shall be divided into three classes (classes shall consist of 2, 2, & 3 members), one class of whom shall be elected each year at the annual meeting held in November for a three year term. No elder shall server on the session for the consecutive terms, either full or partial, aggregating more than three years, but shall be ineligible to be elected to a new term until one year shall have elapsed.

### Proposed wording:

The three to nine elders shall be divided into three classes, one class of whom shall be elected each year at the annual meeting held in November for a three year term. An elder can server on consecutive terms, during an interim period when the church is in undergoing a Pastoral Call. Otherwise no elder shall server on the session for the consecutive terms, either full or partial, aggregating more than three years and shall be ineligible to be elected to a new term until one year shall have elapsed.

#### Reason for the Change:

Allowing session members to continue to remain on session during a period of finding a new Pastor provides for continuity in the search.



### A well-balanced church


