Holy people are supposed to forgive. A Christian lives differently. He answers to a higher calling. But sometimes it doesn't happen. He bleeds and hurts and gets stuck in unforgiveness. It is unnatural to look the other way and forgive. We naturally hang onto grudges and remember how we got hurt. We feel the pain. It stings. People do need to be held accountable for their actions. At the same time we can also forgive them so that the action doesn't keep replaying over and over again in our minds. If someone steals something they need to give it back or make restitution. I can forgive them for their bad choice, and it would also make sense to protect my belongings and set healthy boundaries.

The choice to forgive exonerates me from resentment and hate. It liberates me from living in the trap of wrong emotional ties. People hurt people sometimes because they are hurting and have lots of baggage they don't know how to unpack, or just don't want to do the hard work. Forgiveness doesn't get entangled in another person's unresolved issues. It buries me in a new life. He didn't hold that horrendous injustice against a crowd of self-proclaimed judges. No doubt I am numbered among those self-righteous judges. But He chose to let me off the hook today, and forgive



my many actions when He said, "Father, forgive them; for they do not know what they are doing." I think we do know the kind of action we take against this perfect man, but have no idea the consequences of unleashing what is inside our hearts. Some of the manuscripts from Christian scribes or 'other ancient authorities' lack this sentence. How could this be?

#### 2016 Birthday Offering

The grants for 2016 will go to:

1. Overland Park, Kansas: the program serves boys and girls between 11 and 17 who have been a part of the criminal justice system. These at-risk youth will receive intensive training sessions on character building, core values and life skills.

- 2. Oakland, California: Habitat for Humanity will partner with more than 100 low-income families, many are elderly or disabled.
- 3. Miami, Florida: In 20 communities, the clergy and lay leaders will be trained on ways to stop the flow of children into the school-to prison pipeline.
- 4. Pittsford, New York: In South Sudan our gifts will fund construction of a girls' primary school, levels 1 through 8. In this country the literacy rate is among the lowest in the world, especially for females.

Spring for me, at least, is the season that gives me extra energy, a better outlook on things, some creative spark and the promise of new life. I hope it is for you also. We have had some lovely weather lately and I hope you have been enjoying it.



I wanted to take a moment and update the congregation on the first quarter's income and expenses;

Income thru March 31 was21,400 dollarsExpenses thru March 31 were27,600 dollars

Both income and expenses were right at last year's level for the same period.

The unexpected expenses so far this year were the water line repair at 2,200 dollars, and a new refrigerator at 1,500 dollars (to note-over half the money for the frig was donated into our

"Refrigerator Fund"). We also have a new laptop for the sanctuary; its use will become more apparent when we give Libby and Jane some reprieve this summer from



weekly music duties. The laptop is also used quite extensively each week at Oasis, and will be utilized every night of Vacation Bible School this June. Finally, for the first 3 months this year, we were paying Pastor Andria for full time duties, and that arrangement has now ended. I am certainly thankful for the congregation's faithfulness and generosity.

The announcement Sunday that we received a mission grant from Presbytery is exciting news.



The plans for the event at Geneva Center that the money will be used for is in full swing. Mission It will be in May. 342 dollars were raised for camp

sponsorship on Sunday the 24th of April, with more pledged to be given in the following weeks. Nice!!

In finishing up, I want to ask that each of us please set aside a few moments each day to pray for our church, its future, pray also your roll in its future, and how each one of us can help make a difference.

May God's Peace and the power of the resurrection dwell in each of our hearts.


"Sorry about the delay," said the young man. "Everyone seems to wait until the last minute to get ready for a long trip."
