Rejoice always, pray continually, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus.

He grew up with a stepfather, step brothers and sisters. He was different than his family. He grew up to fulfill a promise that God had made to the world long ago. He grew up to pay a debt that we could not begin to repay.

Yet the world, our nation and our community are so busy with our everyday lives that we can



no longer take more than a few minutes to say thank you. In every circumstance there is something to give thanks for. I remember reading about Corrie ten Boom. She and her sister were in a concentration camp during WWII for helping the Jewish people. Her sister insisted that they give thanks for the bed bugs. Corrie could not imagine why until she realized that the prison guards left that overcrowded room of women alone because they were disgusted by the bugs. Those women had 1 Bible and at night would have a Bible study which led many to Christ. Had it not been for those bed bugs, their area would have been searched, the Bible seized and Corrie and her sister would have been sent to the gas chamber.

Give thanks in all circumstances for this is the will of God for our lives. In hindsight it is easy to give thanks for how God has seen us through a difficulty or used a difficulty to our betterment. In the midst it is not easy.

IF we are truly disciple of Jesus then we DO give thanks in all things even if we aren't sure why. We do it because God wants us to. I have low back arthritis and fibromyalgia. I get worn down with the pain at times. I love God and Jesus is my Savior. It is God's will that I give thanks in all things. Therefore I WILL give thanks for my arthritis and fibromyalgia. For my headaches as well as my home and my friends.
