This book lays out the knowledge we need to know and need to live in our daily lives. It reminds us that we need to not only put ourselves in our family's lives, in our friend's lives, co-worker's lives and the lives of the unsaved, but to casually and lovingly insert God into conversations. Not to be pushy, but mention God, as you are led by the Holy Spirit. This means we need to be attuned to the Holy Spirit. Everyone of else needs to ask God every morning to help us be sensitive to others, and then rely on the Holy Spirit to let us know when it is the right time to introduce them to God. Follow their lead; if they do not want to hear anymore, then we are done. We are done - until they are ready. Bill Hybels gives us 5 steps we can use in telling others abut Christ. These are 5 steps Jesus used with the Woman at the Well. The first is to Bridge the Gap. Do not do anything to be intimidating. Accept them for who they are. Second, a conversation can be started by asking questions. Jesus used something they had in common. They were both at the well for water. He asked her for water. Then he continued by telling her he could give her living water. The third step is to be patient. Jesus knew he could not deal with the woman's sins. She first had to be a believer. Step five is don't let them "drag" you to conversations that will take you away from planting God's seed. The woman at the well changed the subject to where people think they should worship. Jesus' response was it no longer matters where you worship. What matters is if you believe in me. The final step is to give hope. Jesus gave the hope of the living water.

Bill also reminds us that Matthew deliberately gave parties with his old friends (tax collectors) and with his new Christians friends. They mingled and discussed their own backgrounds, giving Jesus's Disciples the chance to talk about the Love of God. Bill warns us when mingling with Christians and non-Christians always have more non-Christians than you have Christians. You do not want the non-Christians to feel like they are "ganged-up "on.



A Letter From Pastor Grace

& Change Progress For some time, the 6 Presbyterian Churches of Carroll County have been seeking ways to enhance the leadership, membership and ministry of their individual congregations. Out of our monthly meetings under the leadership of Rev. David Lawrence both Sessions of Delphi PC and Flora PC have voted to move forward in a cooperative venture. Let me begin by stating that this is in the early planning stages. Nothing is changing for several months. I have been asked to serve as pastor for both Flora and Delphi Presbyterian Churches. This means that I will no longer be the full-time pastor of Flora but will be part time at both. It has been determined that elders should be appointed as part of a liaison team from each church. (A minimum of 2 from each) These 4 will meet with me and with their respective Sessions to review how things are going, what additions or edits need to be made to the relationship and to see how we may cooperatively serve our communities. These elders would be responsible for visitation in their own congregations and will receive additional training. I will be moderating both Session's meetings and presiding over the sacraments of baptism and communion.

The most obvious pro for Flora is a reduction in expenses as pastoral expenses will be split between the 2 congregations. Delphi will benefit from the continuity of leadership.

There are many other benefits and there are some drawbacks. The Session and I are in full agreement that this is the best way to move forward. The next Session meeting is Dec. 17th. I encourage you take your questions and concerns to your elders. We are each happy to talk to you about this new phase of ministry. We won't have all the answers but we are willing find out.

Continue to pray for me and for the Session as we strive together to do God's will here and in the future for the Kingdom of God.
