



How have you had to defend your faith?

Recently I heard a pastor on the radio and was confronted with a conundrum. The preacher was reviewing a passage from scripture regarding the work of the church. He posited that these guidelines were no longer relevant for the church because of what is going on in the world in this day and age. Christian churches are low in numbers throughout the US. We are under persecution from all sides. How can God expect us to follow these stringent guidelines under these circumstances? The minister then began to relate the circumstances that these guidelines were written under. Christians were the minority and under persecution from Pharisees, (Jewish religious leaders) as well as the Romans. Declaring Christ as the Son of God and Messiah was punishable by severe beatings, thrown to the lions, made to fight a gladiator to the death or death. While we here in America do not face this type of severe retribution for our faith, we take for granted our ability to serve God or to not serve Him. Throughout our nation, churches are faced with an aging population which proclaims that they have done their part already. It is time to let someone else take over the work.

While many career paths give a retirement option after age 60-65, for Christians there is no retirement. Even upon our death we enter into Heaven to praise God and serve Him forever.
