My dear sisters & brothers in Christ, How is it with your soul? This is a question that a pastor friend of mine would ask and I now ask others. The common response is, "I'm fine, I'm busy" etc. But the question was not regarding your physical health or your state of activity but was asked about the soul. The part of you that expresses your love and your need for God.

I was asked recently what I needed from God. There are varied levels of answers to this question. The whimsical response is a self-cleaning bathroom & kitchen along with a million dollars. A more serious response is that I need God to open my entire being to be receptive of who God truly is and who I am in God's eyes.

During this season of Advent I challenge you with searching your own heart and soul to know what you need from God. How is it with your soul? I also challenge you to look around your home for reflections of the state of your soul. The adage, "Garbage in- garbage out" is true. If I only read books or watch TV shows that are filled with God affirming truths then my soul will reflect that. If on the other hand I am filling my mind with violence and zombies and such, then my soul will reflect that as well.

"So here's what I want you to do, God helping you: Take your everyday, ordinary life—your sleeping, eating, going-to-work, and walking-around life—and place it before God as an offering. Embracing what God does for you is the best thing you can do for God. Don't become so well-adjusted to your culture that you fit into it without even thinking. Instead, fix your attention on God. You'll be changed from the inside out. Readily recognize what he wants from you, and quickly respond to it. Unlike the culture around you, always



dragging you down to its level of immaturity, God brings the best out of you, develops wellformed maturity in you."


