Cutler Presbyterian Church held a Maundy Thursday service on April 2nd. Our congregation was invited and twelve members participated.

A new order of worship music was given a trial run on April 12th. The music was provided by playing CD's and not with the piano or organ. There were a few little snags along the way, but it was still a worship filled service. I would like to take this time to say, "Thank You" Jane Kearns and Libby Sparks for the hours of practice and the beautiful music that enriches our worship. Another thank you to the choir members that participate in practice and singing. The music that fills our sanctuary is so worshipful and we are blessed for all of these gifts that are shared. Annual Report of the Trustees

During 2015 we took the opportunity to update, replace, repair and paint! If we consider water in the basement during sometime in the spring and summer as normal, then besides that minor problem, we had no major emergency issues.

We did however do the following things:

- 1. Bought a new copier that is also a laser printer. The old copier and the color printer was costing us a ton of money. Just getting away from using so much color ink saves 2,000 dollars per year, and terminating the maintenance contract on the old copier saves several hundred dollars per year.
- 2. New furnaces were installed in the spring. The new ones are high efficiency and will save us several thousand dollars over a five year period.
- 3. A new handrail was installed on the SE steps.
- 4. A new water heater was installed downstairs. The old one died at a very inconvenient time during oasis.
- 5. We upgraded our internet service to a higher speed, so we could actually use the internet. Actually not very much more per year.
- 6. Session and a "website committee" worked very hard and through many trials to finish a new website for the church which is just phenomenal.
- 7. New ballast were installed in several of the florescent light fixtures in the dining room downstairs. The constant buzzing the old one were making were driving people crazy!!
- 8. Many of you that have moved tables recently know we purchased 12 new light weight 8 foot plastic tables for the dining room. What a blessing!! The old ones were donated to the Thrift Shop.
- 9. A new compressor was installed in one of the air conditioners. It went out during the hottest part of the summer!
- 10. The elevator was down for several Sundays but a new capacitor was found and and installed. Hopefully it will last for many years.
- 11. The downstairs hallway and dining room were painted by David Felty and look great.

Annual Report of the Presbyterian Women

Our purpose is to nurture our faith through prayer and Bible Study and to support the Mission of the Church worldwide as well as in our community. During the year, we have tried to keep close to our purpose. For our Bible Study we chose Reconciling Paul, A Contemporary study of 2 Corinthians. Also, we used the magazine Horizons, the Year Book of Prayer, and contributed our Least Coins at each meeting. We open and close each meeting with prayer for persons who need God's love and healing.

We supported the Mission of the Church Worldwide with our pledge to the ongoing mission of the Presbyterian Women. The National and Overseas Missions we sponsored and contributed to were the Birthday Offering and the Thank Offering. Also we gave seeds, tools, chickens, etc. through the Presbyterian Giving Catalog.

Each month several of our women, and sometimes one of our men, work in the Community Thrift Shop. Our entire share of the profit from the Thrift Shop is used for the support of missions. Local Missions were: Oasis, Food Pantry, Christmas Baskets, Buddy Bags, Carroll Released Time Program, and the Helping Hand Fund. We helped to send a young lady to camp at Geneva Center. Out of county support was given to the Kokomo Rescue Mission.

The Community Thrift Shop started in 1963 and our church has always been a part of the six local churches who meet monthly to plan and, of course, to work in the shop. All of our items in the shop are from donations dropped off by many, many people. We have not had a permanent home, and have moved many times, but this year an empty building in the center of Flora was purchased, repaired, and given to the Thrift Shop. Not only has the space tripled, the donations have tripled and so have our share of the profits!

February is the month for our church to furnish workers at the Food Pantry on each Monday and Friday morning.

We welcome and invite all women to attend the meetings on the third Tuesday of each month at 7:00PM March through November.

Christian Education Annual Report

Serving on the Christian Education committee in 2015 were Barb Mayfield, Tammy Moss, Laraine MacLauchlan, Barbara Wilkinson and Laurie Brower. This committee oversees Sunday School, the nursery and Junior Church, Safe Child, Bible Studies and small groups, Vacation Bible School, our Oasis ministry, our church's library, involvement in Christian retreats, and anything that involves discipleship and growth in our Christian walk.

Sunday School

Our first study of 2015 used a Disciple Bible Study of the Psalms led by Pastor Mary Ann Banning, followed by a study of the book of John. Sunday School took a break over the summer and resumed in the fall, meeting at 9:00 a.m. before worship. We are using the "Believe" Bible Study, which is also being used in Oasis.

Bible Study

Over the summer months, an adult Bible Study was held weekly on Wednesday evenings in member's homes. We studied the book of Acts using a study prepared by Pastor Mary Ann Banning.

Vacation Bible School

Working with Cutler Presbyterian and the Flora First Christian Church we hosted a week long VBS June 28th through July 2nd from 6 to 8:30 p.m. each evening. The theme was "Aslan is on the move!" based on the book "The Lion, the Witch, and the Wardrobe" by C.S. Lewis. We reached 64 children and raised over \$1,000 for the VBS mission project, which was support of projects for refugee children through Samaritan's Purse.

Oasis

Our 13th year of Oasis, our mid-week ministry for children and families, ran through spring 2015 and our 14th year kicked off in September. This year and next we are using a resource titled

"Believe" that studies the 10 key beliefs, 10 key practices, and 10 key virtues of being a Christian. Highlights of the year included our annual bowling trip in February, cookout and puttputt golf in August and carnival in Sept. Our hayride this fall was again hosted by the Cutler Presbyterian Church. Our Christmas Celebration to finish the year was attended by over 100 children and parents. A new event, held in place of our annual swim party in April, was a banquet for the families featuring a Christian magician as the entertainment. More than 100 people were in attendance. In the summer, we sponsored Teaha Miller to attend camp at Geneva Center. We are so grateful to the many people who volunteer week in and week out and the generous financial support of our congregation that makes it all possible.

Summer Block Parties

We continued our involvement in 2015 meeting with the six Carroll County Presbyterian Churches and planned three outreach events across the county. We hosted the first of three block parties. The block party in Flora was held on June 24th, followed by one in Delphi on July 29th and one in Cutler on August 23rd. The party was well attended by families living in our neighborhood, which helped attendance at VBS the following week.

Great Banquet

In 2015, we had members serve on and attend Great Banquet retreat weekends.

Library

The church library had a busy year in 2015. We circulated 42 DVD's and 22 books with the Oasis children and interested adults. 33 new books and DVD's were added to the collection, including the complete Chronicles of Narnia – all 7 volumes. We received several donations to our collection and they are available as mysteries in our adult fiction section. Our total collection value is about \$18,000 as there have been several donations. Hopefully in 2016, we will be able to increase our DVD collection as well as add more juvenile books – children really enjoy them. The shelves in the library have been re-positioned so that the Oasis children can more readily find the books pertinent to their grades, i.e. juvenile and young adult.

Annual Report of the Mission and Stewardship Committee

2015 has ended, God has been faithful, and we are prepared financially to go confidently into 2016. 2015 was a year of change. Pastor Mary Ann Banning took a new position in Colorado in late July, followed by a different pulpit fill nearly every week; but we faithfully gave to the church, the food pantry, the Thrift Shop, Oasis, Nepal, One Great Hour of Sharing, Presbyterian Disaster Assistance Fund, the Hunger Fund, the JOY offering, and honored our commitment to Presbytery. Thank you and may God Bless us in 2016.

In 2015, income from all sources was \$ 95,867. Total expenses were \$ 91,898. The 2015 Budget for spending was \$ 98,500. Worth noting are that contributions for 2015 were \$ 13,258 and pledges were \$ 70,276; and for 2016 people have made pledges exceeding those numbers. Additionally, many repairs were completed, some new office equipment was purchased, two new furnaces were installed, painting was completed downstairs, and a new website was completed. Please review the Trustee's Report for more details.

As you know, all of the Carroll County Presbyterian churches are facing strains on membership and hence finances. By the grace of God, with the dedicated leadership we have, and with a congregation faithful in its giving, we can stride into 2016, able to offer a full time pastor a very respectable pay package. Continue to pray every day that we will listen to God and follow the path to a new pastor He has laid out for us.

Be assured God has a plan for us! If we ask ourselves, "Would the community miss us if we were gone?" Yes. There is much more work to do, more services to provide, care to be given, prayers to be said, and Joy to find.
