

For over a year, Flora and Delphi Presbyterian Churches have been seeking ways to better serve God in our communities. The decision was made to share a pastor and become a Parish.

A Liaison Team was formed with 3 members from each church along with the treasurers to work on the Pastor's Terms of Call. They have done a tremendous job for which we can all be thankful.

What seemed to be a long and tedious journey has begun to move very quickly. In fact, the change is happening now. Beginning July 1, I will be preaching at Delphi PC at 9 AM and at Flora PC at 10:30.

The Liaison Team name has changed to Parish Council. They will continue to meet with me to plan for the future. As a Parish, we will remain individual congregations but will work together to proclaim the Word of God to the community and to the world. We will share in each other's burdens as well as in our joys.

So, what will Sunday morning look like? For Delphi – Worship at 9 with Fellowship to follow. I will stay for fellowship on the 1<sup>st</sup> & 3<sup>rd</sup> Sundays of the month

For Flora – Fellowship at 10 with Worship at 10:30. I will attend fellowship on the 2<sup>nd</sup> & 4<sup>th</sup> Sundays. 5<sup>th</sup> Sundays will be a joint service. (The next one is in September and Flora will host)

This will take some getting used to. Please know that the Worship Committee, Christian Ed, and Congregational Life are working together to make these changes work. There will still be Sunday School and coffee time and worship. These changes are not carved in stone. The Parish Council will be listening to the congregations concerns and suggestions. If after a few months, the arrangement needs to be adjusted we are open to that.

When Jesus returns, the only thing that will matter is that we were worshipping God when we came together in the house of the Lord. Keep the Parish Council and your session

leaders in prayer as they strive to serve God and the congregation.
