# "Beware: I'm meddling"

"And Jesus grew in wisdom and stature, and in favor with God and man." Luke 2:54 As followers of Jesus how do we maintain an attitude or willingness to learn and grow? I was recently reminded of many things that I take for granted. The main one is knowledge of the Bible. We no longer live in an era where most kids have some knowledge of basic Bible stories. Biblical illiteracy is on the rise. School is starting back on August 8. As a community and as a nation we place importance on education. Being able to pass the exams is very important to us. We give great honor to those who have achieved higher education. Yet we do not give importance to learning about God.

There are many who read the scriptures on a regular basis and attend Sunday School or a Bible study. Yet there are many more who believe that they know all there is to learn from the Bible and have quit studying it or believe that there is nothing to really learn from it that would affect daily life.

I remember years ago asking some teenage boys why they quit going to Sunday School. They quickly told me that they had outgrown it. Sunday School was for children and women. Their fathers did not participate in Sunday School regularly and there were no men teaching Sunday School, so why should they be made to go? I then went and talked to some of my male classmates in seminary about teaching Sunday School. They said they were too busy or that their wives taught.

Oasis is about to resume for the 17<sup>th</sup> year. Many of us pray for a revival in our community, yet it is difficult to get folks to teach the Bible to these kids. Our Christian Ed chair, Barbara Pearce is trying to figure out how we can have adult Sunday School in the morning AND have

children's Sunday School. Who would be willing to lead the class? How can we effectively reach the 40-50 kids who attend on Wednesday evenings with only a few adults who are willing to fully interact with them. This summer we had the joy and honor to welcome 5 souls into the Kingdom of God through Baptism. We have gained 6 new members to our congregation. William Merrill wrote a wonderful hymn in 1911, "Rise up o men of God". I am calling on each member of this congregation to rise up and help your fellowman to learn about Christ and to help them to grow in wisdom and in stature and in favor with both God and humanity. Let us arise from our Spiritual slumber and continue to grow in faith and to lead others into a saving knowledge of Jesus Christ as their Lord and Savior. Amen.

And we are looking forward in a joint worship service with Delphi Presbyterian on the 29<sup>th</sup> of this month at Diane and Jim Justice's house on the river. It has been a very busy and blessed July.

Just one last thing from the worship committee. We are a small congregation, but I believe we have touched many lives for the Kingdom of God in so many ways just in the last year or so. We have helped send an ambulance to Africa; the parents and kids at Oasis raised enough money to buy goats, chickens, and pigs to send to communities that desperately need them for a continuous source of food. Our congregation helped raise enough money (and then some) to build a chicken coup in Haiti. We have sent many kids to Geneva Center for a week of fun and Christian fellowship. We have put together a VBS with the help of other churches as an outreach to the kids in the community. We have fed kids with a good meal and the word of God on Wednesday nights. We have given food baskets and Christmas gifts to the needy during the holidays. The Presbyterian Women are always there to support mission projects as well as being the compassionate and loving face to the wider community by running the Flora Thrift Shop. They have made sure that the community supports the blood drive and other community events. Many in our congregation have visited the sick, prayed with the needy and been there to support family and friends and strangers when there was a need. Some have welcomed a child into their loving and stable home when the child needed a home to call their own. Many individuals, as well as the church, have shared their resources to those who find themselves in crisis.

Worship is more than music, bulletins, preaching, praying, tithing and fellowship. Faith without works is dead, and even though we are a small congregation, we are very much alive.


