Properly and In Order: The Presbyterian Mantra

As I sit in the office today at the computer, I am on my 3rd cup of coffee and have just completed another Committee meeting. While each meeting is of importance to the life of a congregation, they can sometimes be tiring to my spirit. I have known of pastors who so dreaded committee meetings that they chose to do everything themselves instead of seeking input from others. While this may on the surface be easier, it is not the Presbyterian Way. Nor is it healthy for the congregation. In both churches I have been guiding the Session towards intentionally seeking out members of the congregation for committee work. As Presbyterians we are governed by the people who elect elders to be the Spiritual Leaders and the voice of the congregation in various matters. We do not elect someone to serve because they are really good at playing an instrument or can fix the sump pump when needed. We elect men and women to be Spiritual Leaders of the church who will serve as chair of a committee and lead that group with the help of the Holy Spirit in making decisions. The Session meets to discuss the various committee work and vote on matters as needed. As the Pastor, I guide the Session in their deliberations.

Elders on Session are also given a list of members for whom they are to care for. They are to be praying daily for the congregants on their list and to seek ways to guide them into a fuller relationship with Jesus Christ. Churches across the nation have stopped expecting the Elders to be Spiritual Leaders. And across the nation, congregations have been in rapid decline. We have stopped expecting members of the congregation to take part in the ministry of the church through committee service. A handful of folks take care of the church work and everyone else is a bench warmer. To use sports analogy; which of you would intentionally sign up to be on a

Football/baseball team so that you could sit on the bench and not participate in the game? Membership in the church is both a joy and a privilege. I have recently started using the Book of Order: Ministry of Members for our Call to Worship. I was asked by someone on the Nominating Committee to do this as a reminder. If we are to serve our Lord and Savior by being a part of the ministry in our community, then we need to go back to the basics and do things properly and in order.

Pray for our Nominating Committees. Pray for our Session Elders. Pray that God would give you a desire to serve alongside of Him as we minister to one another and to our community. For it is only in Jesus name that we have a church at all. Your sister in Christ, Pastor Grace


Session Meeting Updates


