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Pastor's Annual Report

I can hardly believe that I have been here a full year. Yet it is January 2018, and I began as your pastor in November 2016. This past year I have tried some new things, gotten a better understanding of the how & why things are done a certain way yet still have much to learn. While I am a mature woman with many years of life and church experience, I am reminded that this is my first call as an Ordained Minister. Your prayers and your patience with me is very greatly appreciated.

Here are some of the changes that you may have noted:

Sunday Worship

- 1. Announcements are now on Power Point before service begins and continues playing until we pass the peace of Christ.
- 2. Our organist, Libby Sparks, plays following the Passing of the Peace to gather everyone back to their seats.
- 3. The first 2 scripture readings are also on Power Point to make it easier for folks to follow along.
- 4. Children's moment is now a regular part of the morning service.
- 5. Contemporary music for the first song has been experimented with. This has received mixed reviews. My hope is that as more people are trained on the computer and sound system that this can be improved and reintroduced.

Changes were also made in the Fall to the Wednesday evening service which is traditionally known as the Oasis Program.

- 1. I have been encouraging the committees and congregation to change their view of this service. We are moving from a ministry that "we do for them" to seeing this as a second worship service of our congregation.
- 2. The time in the sanctuary now includes more features which are seen on Sunday morning. It is less formal, but includes corporate prayer, praise music and a brief sermon. (I am continually striving to shorten the message on Wednesday night.) While some of these elements have always been a part of the Oasis evening, my plan is to be more intentional with the sanctuary time as worship time.
- 3. I am learning that despite all my education and training, teenagers are not the same as when I was a kid. My tolerance of certain behaviors is not what it was 10 years ago. I am continually reminded of how much improved the kids are from 16 years ago when Oasis begun. I truly appreciate the patience and endurance of each of the leaders every Wednesday night. Continue to pray for me as I strive to follow God's calling in this ministry. It is my desire that each of them become true disciples of Jesus the Christ.

Visitation

One of my personal challenges is visiting people in their home for the first time. I have visited some this past year and should have visited several more. Please know that if ever you would like me to make a visit, you only need to ask. Communion was served by me in the homes of 4 church members. Again, if any would like to have communion brought to them, I will gladly do so.

Care Fund

One of my responsibilities is to discern needs when someone calls for financial assistance. A few folks have been helped with rent, food, gas and utilities. I have empowered our secretary, Beth

Zootman to give \$25 for utility assistance when someone calls. This money is sent directly to the utility company.

Working with Super Valu grocery store, gift cards can be purchased for food only items. Rent is paid directly to the landlord and I have met with various folks at the gas station and given the money to the attendant for gas or used the debit card at the pump. No cash is given to the individual.

This past year I have met or talked with different township trustees in our area. In a meeting with local pastors, we began discussion of how we might streamline assisting with the needs in Flora.

We did, however, get the opportunity to purchase two nice heavier duty stoves for the kitchen with money donated for them. They are used in some capacity nearly every week, and are vital to Oasis. The sump pump in the elevator was upgraded and as it turns out, needed desperately late this fall when 5 inches of rain fell in Flora. The subsequent water coming onto the new carpet was disappointing and pushed us to have Anderson Plumbing clean out our drainage lines from the sinks and then seal a floor drain in the hallway that had always overflowed from either rains or too much water drained out of the sinks.

Grass mowing, flower planting and watering; weed killing has all been done by the McGills for the last several years. They, sadly, are no longer able to do it and we will need to find their replacement before spring.

Annual Report of the Presbyterian Women

Our purpose is to nurture our faith through prayer and Bible Study and to support the Mission of the Church worldwide as well as in our community. During the year, we have tried to keep close to our purpose. For our Bible Study, we chose "Who is Jesus?" and also used the magazine, Horizons, the Yearbook of Prayer, and contributed our Least Coins at each meeting. Our meetings opened and closed with prayer for those who need God's love and healing.

We supported the Mission of the Church Worldwide with our pledge to the ongoing mission of Presbyterian Women. The National and Overseas Missions we sponsored and contributed to were the Birthday and Thank Offering, Presbyterian Disaster Relief, African Ambulance Mission, South Sudan Evangelical Mission, and a new garden well and pumps for a community in Ghana.

Local missions were: Oasis, Christmas Baskets, County Food Pantry, Helping Hand Fund, Religious Education and Students Services in the Carroll Schools, Buddy Bags, Church Camp Scholarships, Canine Division of the Sheriff's Department and Kokomo Rescue Mission.

Each month all of the Mary Martha Circle women, and sometimes our men, work in the Community Thrift Shop. The donations, shoppers and income continue to increase. Six churches share ownership and pledge to give all their share of the profits to missions of their choosing. This year each share was \$5,300.00.

February is the month for our church to furnish needed supplies and workers at the Food Pantry on each Monday and Friday morning.

We welcome and invite all women of our church to attend the meetings on the third Tuesday of each month at 7:00 p.m., March through November.

During the first few months of 2017, we were still looking at the book "Believe. Starting in September we studied some really awesome ways to lead others to Christ with the book "Just Walk Across the Room" We are finishing the year, looking at ways people of different social economic settings see life and there possible changes for success in the book A Framework for Understanding Poverty.

Oasis Ministry

From January – April, 2016, we finished our 15 year of Oasis still in the book of Believe. The 16th year of Oasis began with leaders, Barb Mayfield, Pastor Grace, Martha Clark, Joe Mayfield and Kevin Clark filling in as needed. A few mothers and grandmothers also helped, where needed. Our music during Worship time was led by Nick Root. Laurie Brower and Donna Sholty keep our weekly meals going with help from many volunteers: from our church, from Delphi Presbyterian, and from Cutler Presbyterian. Starting in September the children started looking at the Ways of the World versus the Way Gods is leading us to live our lives. Some of the hard topics we covered were Bullying, Suicide, Greed, and Materialism. Some fun extra activities we did that the children liked were bowling in February, swimming in April, putt-putt golf in August, hayride in November, and a Christmas celebration in December. Oasis would not be possible without everyone's help. We are so grateful for all the Volunteer Work and for the Financial Support of this Church, Cutler Presbyterian and Delphi Presbyterian.

Summer Camp

With the Mission Grant we had received in 2015 and with the much needed gifts from this congregation we sent 12 children to Geneva Camp in the summer of 2016. This is a marvelous way for the young children in our community to learn about God's Love.

Vacation Bible School

Vacation Bible School was started off with a Block Party on Saturday, June 10th, 2017 to introduce the VBS's Mission Project (African Ambulance Mission) which raised \$3,140.83. Working with First Christian Church and Cutler Presbyterian Church we hosted a week long VBS starting 6/11 through 6/18/2017. We continued the theme of Amazing Race, but visited new countries and learned new Bible Stories every night. The Curriculum was a joint venture of all three churches.

Annual Report of the Mission and Stewardship Committee

Again in 2017, like many faithful years in the past, we supported the Food Pantry, Oasis, Geneva Center summer camp, the Thrift Store, Vacation Bible School, One Great Hour of Sharing, the Christmas Joy Offering, the Birthday Offering, the Thank Offering, World Hunger Fund, the Presbyterian Disaster Relief Fund, and many local people in need through our Care Fund. One of the most interesting projects this year was our fund-raising event during VBS with Hassimi Tradore and his Ambulance for Africa mission. He is an amazing gentleman with a fascinating story of coming out of poverty. We raised over \$3,000 for the second ambulance he delivered to Fakina Fosa, his home country. Thank you all for your willingness to give. I know it is also the hope of many in our congregation to participate in a special "hands-on trip" to do mission work outside our local area. Be praying about that and other opportunities for mission work in 2018.
