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Pastor's Annual Report

It is so very true, the older we get the faster time speeds by. Yet once again it is time for the Annual Report. We have truly seen the Lord at work in our church and community. Four families joined the church and 3 left to serve the Lord elsewhere. We were blessed with 8 baptisms as well.

We continue to move forward seeking God's will for our congregation and for the community. Here is a list of some of the changes that have taken place.

Full- Time Pastor to Half -Time

With the decrease in finances, it became necessary for me to change from full-time to parttime. With this change I became part-time pastor for First Presbyterian of Delphi in addition to my part-time responsibilities here in Flora. After many years of meetings, these 2 churches have chosen to create a Parish. While I am technically part-time at each, I consider myself to be the fulltime Parish Pastor. Throughout this report you will see how this has affected various aspects of our ministry. <u>Sunday Worship</u>

- 1. Children are now a regular part of the worship service as acolytes, scripture readers and singers.
- 2. Worship time changed on July 1. With the decision to create a Parish with First Presbyterian in Delphi, we moved the service to 10:30 AM. Fellowship time is between Sunday School and Worship. This was a 15-minute change to our previous Worship time and a rearranging of the fellowship time.
- 3. In September we welcomed a new Music Director, Toni Brewster. I will let you read about her in the Worship Committee report.

Bible Study

- 1. We now have 3 Bible studies plus children's Sunday School class.
 - a. Sunday morning: Adult & Children's class
 - b. Sunday afternoon: Study of Paul at Delphi Church Office
 - c. Thursday evenings: Adult Bible study: Walk through the Bible

<u>Oasis</u>

Last year I was encouraging our congregation to see Oasis as a "2nd Worship Service". While it is still and will continue to be a Mission Outreach to the community, it is a vital part of our congregation's worship opportunities. This change in perspective has created growth for our Sunday morning worship and the congregation as a whole. Three of the new families have come out of our Oasis ministry.

We have been blessed to have a new partner in this ministry – First Christian Church of Flora. Their new pastor, Kim Holley and I were able to collaborate with Cutler Presbyterian which has been and still is a vital partner in Oasis. As it has become more difficult to get volunteers to help in this mid-week ministry we are grateful for the Lord's provision. First Christian has added to our leadership staff and the kitchen staff as well. They have also been a blessing as we raise funds for summer camp. We look forward to a long, fruitful partnership.

We have been especially blessed with the formation of a Prayer Team headed up by Jane & Bill Kearns. They have a list of all Oasis students and adults for whom they pray regularly. I'm sure they would welcome additional prayer warriors.

Nominating Committee

This past year I made changes to the method that is used by the Nominating Committee. The title has remained the same, yet their primary task has greatly changed. Those who are going off Session along with 3 congregants met regularly for prayer. They began with the list of all members

who were eligible to serve as an elder. These names were divided out, prayed for, passed around and prayed for some more.

The NC is being very intentional in seeking God's guidance for our new leaders. For the primary task of an elder is to be a Spiritual Leader for the congregation and a committee chair second. The new NC will begin meeting in February for Bible study and prayer as they seek God's guidance for 2020.

Visitation

While it is still my joy to visit with folks, the changes from full-time to part-time created an even greater need for Elders to take on Deacon roles. The church membership was divided out among the elders. Each person should have received a card, letter or phone call notifying you who your elder was. With the new year, these may change somewhat.

Elders are responsible for regular visits and contacts with all of our members. If requested, I will also visit. I will do my best to visit when someone is in the hospital and to take communion with the elders upon request.

Care Fund

This has remained as it was last year. A few folks have been helped with rent, food, gas, utilities and winter clothing. We are receiving fewer calls as we now require that the individual or family be signed up with the area trustees or be a member of this church. This is not to prevent help from being given but to make us better stewards of the resources we have. With limited funds we must discern between giving assistance to all who request it and having what a person actually needs.

I continue to be in conversation with area pastors as we seek to aide our community without enabling.

This coming year, the Parish Council is working on a strategic plan for outreach and service to both Flora & Delphi communities. I look forward to working within the Parish to bring more people into the kingdom of God and to help us all grow in our discipleship to Jesus the Christ.

I am also encouraging each member of the congregation to participate in the process by signing up for a Committee. It has been said that 5% of the congregation does 95% of the work. No one's work for the Lord is completed until you personally hear, "Well done thou good and faithful servant. Enter into your rest."

Thank you for allowing me to be a part of all that God is doing here in Flora. At times it is hard for me to believe that this Southern girl with a penchant for country music, country ham and southern combread is living the dream here in the heartland of America. Your sister in Christ,

Annual Report of the Congregational Life Committee

This committee is responsible to develop and organize congregational fellowship activities that address the needs of the congregation and to foster spiritual fellowship by inviting congregation members, and by also reaching out to local community members, to participate in small groups and congregational gatherings. Annual Report of the Worship Committee

Communion

Flora Presbyterian church serves communion by intinction and is usually given on the first Sunday of the month. We made an exception and served communion on Mother's and Father's day, and, Maundy Thursday, and Christmas Eve. The average number of congregants served on communion Sunday is 32, the largest service was Christmas Eve with 51 present.

Special services

Ash Wednesday service was held at the church in the evening with Oasis kids and adults, along with members from the Cutler and Delphi Presbyterian church in attendance.

Maundy Thursday Service was held at Delphi Pres. and 25 members were served communion.

As the tradition, Delphi invited Flora to worship at Adam's Mill. Gabe, Aden, and Autumn Mauer and Laura Gordon were baptized and became members of the Flora church.

Judah, Kolton, Shawn Ross, and Janessa Pitts were baptized and accepted into the church along with their mother, Deloris.

During Advent, families were involved in lighting of the Advent candles and sharing the meaning of each Symbol during services.

December 9th the Christian church hosted a Christmas program with their choir and our Bell Choir. Wednesday 19th, was the Oasis Christmas party with close to 100 attending for dinner and worship service. Bibles were given to the 4th graders, as our tradition, during the service and Christmas bags were distributed to the kids.

Christmas Eve Candle light service was held at Flora. Many members of the Delphi congregation were in attendance.

Joint worship services with Delphi are held every 5th Sunday. Each church takes turns hosting the services, usually a luncheon is held afterwards at the church.

Christmas baskets

The church sponsored 5 families with Christmas baskets. Food and toys were distributed December 15th. Food and toys were donated by church members, Psi Iota Xi Sorority donated additional toys for the children, and ground pork was donated by the Carroll County Pork produces.

Hanging of the Greens took place on Thanksgiving Sunday. Lunch was served afterwards.

Worship committee meetings

Worship committee meetings were held in March, April, August, and October.

Special meetings/Events

March 25th a luncheon and training session for the Acolytes were held after the worship service. Autumn, Gave and Aden Mauer and Mason Eakins were in attendance. Pastor Grace conducted the training and the history of Acolytes were discussed

Clarification meeting was held on April 9th with David Lawrence as the moderator and Jennifer_____. The agenda was to clarify and discuss how the Delphi and Flora church were going to share the pastor. August 29th a Safe Child Certification meeting was held at the church that included all adults that were anticipating volunteering for Oasis. The meeting was conducted at the Church. Overviews of the Safe Child policies were discussed. Everyone attending signed an application for Criminal background checks.

Miscellaneous

Donations for the flower memorial fund were collected on March 18th and 25 and in December before Christmas.

October, the flow of the service was changed somewhat. The prayer concerns would be moved to before the "Passing of the Peace", the intercessory prayer would be moved to right after the confession of sins, the choir would go the the choir loft and sing during the offertory time. This was implemented on the 14th.

Annual Report of the Presbyterian Women

Our purpose is to nurture our faith through prayer and Bible Study and to support the Mission of the Church worldwide as well as in our community. During the year we have tried to keep close to our purpose. For our Bible Study we chose "Cloud of Witnesses" and also used Horizons, the Yearbook of Prayer, and contributed our Least Coins at each meeting. Our meetings open and close with prayer for those who need God's love and healing.

We supported the Mission of the Church Worldwide with our pledge to the ongoing mission of Presbyterian Women. The National and Overseas Missions we sponsored and contributed to were the Birthday Offering, Presbyterian Disaster Relief, and a Family Farm Bundle to give a family livestock such as chickens, piglets, goats, or a cow as well as seeds, tools and training to support successful farming.

Local missions were Oasis, Christmas Baskets, County Food Pantry, Helping Hand Fund, Religious Education, Buddy Bags, Church Camp Scholarships, Canine Division of the Sherriff's Department, Vacation Bible School, gas for the Garden Spot Express, Brady's Hope, and money to the Lions Club to help fund a van. Also gifts were made to the Kokomo Rescue Mission, Birthright of Delphi, and Geneva Center.

Each month all of the Mary Martha Circle women, and sometimes our men, work in the Community Thrift Shop. The donations, shoppers and income continue to increase. Six churches share ownership and pledge to give all their share of the profits to missions of their choosing, This year each share was \$8,950.00.

February is the month for our church to furnish needed supplies and workers at the food pantry on each Monday and Friday morning.

We welcome and invite all women to attend the meetings on the third Tuesday of each month at 7:00 p.m., March through November.

MISSION STATEMENT

Serving on the Christian Education Committee in 2018 Were Martha Clark, Dough MacLauchlan, and Gerry Hollis. This Committee oversees Sunday School, the Nursery, Safe Child, Bible Studies and small groups, Vacation Bible School, the Oasis Ministry, Library. Christian Retreats, and anything that involves Christian discipleship and growth.

Sunday School

During the first of 2018, Adult Sunday School studied The Prodigal Son by John McArthur. This booked explained what the people of the times thought of the prodigal son, the older son and the father through explaining the customs and the family interaction of those times. The book discussed God's Grace for each of us and reminded us that we are sinners and need to repent. Adult Sunday School is now studying "Entrusted, Study of II Timothy" by Beth Moore. Beth explains God has entrusted us with the Gospel of Jesus Christ. Paul, the writer of II Timothy, states each of us are to share the Good News with everyone. Adult Sunday School averaged 4-6 students during 2018.

The Children studied the books of the bible and where they are found. In the month of November, they also looked at why we should be Thankful. Children's Sunday School ended in 2018 with the birth of Jesus Christ. Children's Sunday School started in the fall of 2019 and averaged 3-7 students.

Oasis

Oasis has taken on a new look in its 17th year. Pastor Grace Hammer is the Acting Director. First Christian Church has been added to the list of volunteers. Pastor Kim Holley has been assisting with Bible Stories and Worship Time. Cutler Presbyterian Church is still helping to spread the word and love of God to our Children. In additions to Pastor Kim, other members of the First Christian Church have helped with preparing meals and working with the children. We looked at Love as discussed in I Corinthians 13. This study included God sending Jesus, Jesus loving the Sick Woman, the Samaritan Woman, Jesus' love for Zacchaeus and God's love never fails. This year the studies were rotated with crafts, games and music. The children occasional enjoyed Trivia Games on lessons learned. We held special programs for Christmas and Ash Wednesday.

Oasis still started with a meal from 6:00 to 6:30, which was followed by worship time. The rotations were for 2 weeks. The first week 2 groups went to Bible Study and games, the second week they went to music and crafts. The other 2 groups had music and crafts the first week and Bible Study and games the second week.

Oasis Bowling and Roller Skating

Oasis children went to on their annual Bowling Party in February 2018. For the first time in 2018 the children also went Roller Skating. Children had to bring parents along for the Roller Skating. Both events were paid for with monies donated specifically to the Oasis Program. All monies for Oasis is separate from tithes to Flora Presbyterian Church.

Vacation Bible School

There was an average of 25 children for VBS from July 8-12, 2018. The First Christian Church, Cutler Presbyterian Church and Flora Presbyterian Church worked together for VBS's success. This was our last year for The Amazing Race. This year the children looked at God's Amazing Grace while traveling to Burma, Russia, Haiti, Iceland and back to the USA. The children learned God Forgives us through Jesus Christ, God welcomes us into a relationship with him, God comes to us and leads us to him, God frees us from sin and there will be a day when God fully restores us.

Summer Camp at Geneva Center

During the summer of 2018 we sent 12 children to Summer Camps at the Geneva Center. This was done with a Mission Grant of \$2,900.00 from the Wabash Valley Presbytery, plus donations from Cutler Presbyterian Church, Mary Martha Circle (Presbyterian Women) and the Flora Presbyterian Church. During 2018 Pastor Grace, Congregational Life and Christian Ed made plans for Fund Raisers to enable children go to Geneva Center Summer Camps during 2019. We will also apply for another Mission Grant.

Missions

Oasis raised \$200.00 for the Compassion International during the year of 2018. Vacation Bible School raised \$2800.00 our Haiti Mission Project.
