Covet: To desire wrongfully, inordinately, or without due regard for the rights of others: to **covet** another's property. to wish for, especially eagerly: He won the prize they all coveted.

I must confess that I have coveted in my heart. Sometimes this is joked about but it is a very real sin that must be confessed and God's guidance sought out. This may seem like a little thing, but it quickly escalated into my being angry with my housemates, angry with myself and taking steps to go into debt to satisfy my coveting. I *had* to have what my sinful heart desired.

How often do we feel that way about other churches? We see a mega church with lots of young families and programs. We begin to covet their membership list and their budget. We become angry or at least disgruntled with ourselves and the church leadership for not making that happen



here. At this stage in our church life we are not fully prepared for that type of increase. We may never be. That does not change our responsibilities nor should it change our devotion to God.

Are we entering the church on Sunday with thanksgiving in our hearts for the ministry that God has given us? Are we being good stewards of our resources both financial and fiscal of what we already have? Or do we spend so much time complaining about what we do NOT have that we take it for granted?

Stewardship, Mission, Finance, Personnel

The committee met on May 29th to begin the process of the financial review. Marshall McCammack and Libby Sparks have agreed to perform the review and we thank them for their willingness to serve.

Total income for the months of January thru March was \$21,519.12 and total expenses were \$16,176.54 for a year-to-date net income of \$5,342.58. , \$800 was received from the Smock Foundation for assessment of the church's sound system, \$250 was paid to Presbytery for the 2018 Christmas Joy Offering \$200 (balance of 2018 pledge) was paid to Carroll County Ministries for religious education and \$300 was paid to Carroll County Food Pantry. As of March 31st, our expenses are 7% ahead of budgeted figures.
